

This tool is designed to collect from students, basic information on preferred forms of address. It can be changed to suit the instructors needs and distributed in paper format or via Canvas in the form of a quiz. The Canvas quiz can, then be downloaded as a spreadsheet suitable for generating a roster for the purposes of communication, rather than the list of legal information currently spilling out of Canvas.

We recommend that instructors provide the same basic information to students: In class, I go by the name Professor Bryson (BR-EYE-sun), and I use they/them pronouns. I usually snack on apples but my downfall is Pop Tarts.

importing the Canvas Quiz and getting a spreadsheet from that.

Download the "Inclusive_Introductions_Questionnaire.zip" file (and leave it zipped). http://educ.jmu.edu/~brysonbp/IIQ/Inclusive_Introductions_Questionnaire_for_Canvas.zip

Add the quiz to your course:

1. From your course's "Settings" page, choose "Import Course Content"
2. On the resulting page, choose "Canvas Course Export Package"
3. Click the "Choose File" button locate the "Inclusive_Introductions_Questionnaire.zip" file
4. Choose "All Content," then click Import
5. The questionnaire will appear under Quizzes, unpublished and with no due date.

Once in your course, you can adapt it to your needs by clicking the Edit button and the Questions tab. Don't forget to save your changes!

After students have answered, download the spreadsheet:

1. Click the Inclusive Introductions Questionnaire from the Quiz or Assignments page.
2. In the upper right-hand corner, click "Quiz Statistics."
3. Click the "Student Analysis" button to generate and download the report.
4. Open the file: "Inclusive_Introductions_Questionnaire_Student_Analysis_Report.csv"
5. It needs a little cleaning to be useful.

The first 8 columns are from Canvas and can be deleted or used to match records.

6. Responses are in alternate columns. I would change the headers to:

Name, Pronunciation, Pronoun, Alt-Pronoun, Snack, AboutMe (delete the rest)

Keep column A if you need a key to connect classroom names to Canvas records. Otherwise, delete columns A through H, above, and columns J,L,N,P, and R-W, below. Then rename the question headers. For example, in column M, below, I would change “54271: Please...” to **pronouns**. Useful Excel skills include selecting columns (click the lettered headers), delete columns (left-click), change column width (drag the lines between headers), and Format/Cells/Alignment/WrapText.
