# A. Homework

- Students are permitted to work together on the *R* homework, without directly copying other students' work. - All homework scores count toward one's final grade; i.e., no scores are dropped.
- No late homeworks will be accepted.

#### B. Exams

- Exams are closed book and closed notes.
- Each student will be allowed to bring to each exam a calculator, although students may not share calculators.
- The final exam is cumulative.
- At least 80% of the weighting of the exams will come from modifications to the (non-R) homework problems and in-class examples.
