


- Gopher tortoises dig deep holes into the ground.
- These deep holes are called "burrows."
- The burrows are around 30 feet deep.



- Gopher tortoises dig and live in these burrows; But many small animals, such as mice, frogs and rabbits, live in them too.
- These burrows protect them from predators and harsh weather.

Where in the United States you can find gopher tortoises:

Why am I in danger?

- The gopher tortoise population is decreasing.
- They are suffering from

losing their habitats.

Their burrows are being destroyed by humans



- and other animal predators.
- This leaves them without a home for shelter.
- Without shelter, gopher tortoises are at a higher risk of being eaten by predators.

The gopher tortoise is a land turtle that originated in North America 60 million years ago. That means it is one of the oldest living species on Earth!


