Pet Care

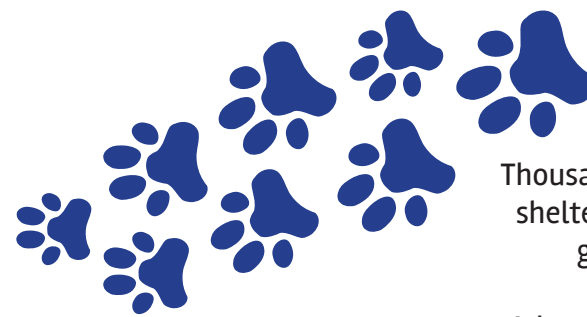
- Temporary pet care and positive reinforcement training
- Reduction of local pet overpopulation in conjunction with local veterinarians and the Shenandoah Valley Spay/Neuter clinic
- Prevention of cruelty to animals and assistance to Animal Control for animals in abusive situations
- Disaster relief/emergency quartering of pets
- Cremation services

For Owners

- Humane education programs

Shelter volunteers work on-site with adoptable pets. After taking an orientation class to familiarize them with policies, training, and techniques, the volunteers will spend their time

- cuddling/Interacting with cats
- socializing/Walking dogs
- showcasing pets in local areas
- assisting fundraiser events
- providing a foster home and
- transporting pets to high-adoption shelters and breed-specific rescue groups

Adoption

- Adoption applicants must complete a screening form as the first step towards acquiring a pet
- All dog and cats required to be spayed or neutered
- SPCA trained staff will help you find the pet that's a right match for you
